

Error 451 is a new error code that we want ISPs to show when people visit websites blocked for legal reasons. Courts can require ISPs to block access to certain websites. Showing the Error 451 message makes it clear when a website has been blocked after a court order.

In <u>computer networking</u>, HTTP 451 Unavailable For Legal Reasons is an error <u>status code</u> of the <u>HTTP</u> protocol to be displayed when the user requests a resource which cannot be served for legal reasons, such as a web page censored by a government. The number 451 is a reference to <u>Ray Bradbury</u>'s 1953 <u>dystopian</u> novel <u>Fahrenheit 451</u>, in which books are outlawed.[1] 451 could be described as a more explanatory variant of <u>403 Forbidden.[2]</u> This status code is standardized in <u>RFC 7725</u>.
